

The Community 100DayProject launched in Marquette, Michigan on January 21, 2014. This is its first offering. Over 165 people (called "Arters") registered to participate in this creativity movement. Most of the Arters are from the Upper Peninsula -- however there are also Arters from New Mexico, New York, Texas, Chicago, even as far away as Guatemala and Tanzania working on projects.

Beyond the 100 Days

When 100 day projects end, sometimes there's a let down. You've been on a journey for the past 100 days, making new discoveries, experimenting, playing. It's become part of your daily routine, occupying your thoughts. A companion of sorts.

When it ends, there's bound to be some adjustment.

Here's what some of the October 2013 exhibit artists said when their projects ended. Maybe your experience will be similar, maybe different.

"After I completed my 100 Day Project I noticed a bit of

a letdown. I made it through the early stages which included the ups and downs that teeter-totter from boredom to the enthusiasm and discovery stage. It is at this stage that the process and products got a firm hold of my attention and motivated me. I didn't want to lose that feeling". - Catherine Benda

"I noticed a sense of loss and mourning. I wanted to continue – to visit my 'little friends' and play each day again. Unfortunately, I did not return to visit, not daily nor even weekly after my commitment ended. I don't know why, but then I never expected to feel such emptiness after completion". – Julie Benda

"I felt both relief and excitement. Glad the 100 days was over as I was missing my regular studio work. Excitement because something wonderful was starting to happen with the clay pieces I was making towards the end of the 100 days. The clay work up until then felt more like a warm up to me. But that's what practice is about, right?" - Ann Russ

Impact

One of many payoffs of doing 100 day projects is the impact it's likely to have on your life, your work. Sometimes that impact is known right away, other times it's discovered weeks or months after your project ends.

Here are what some 2013 100DayProject exhibit artists noticed about the impact their projects had for them.

"*Going into the studio has become a life habit!*" - Louisa Barkalow

"The biggest impact this has had on me is the understanding the importance of process, habit and flow. This became for me a daily dialogue." -- Catherine Benda "After my project ended it felt more natural to explore and ask more questions of my materials. I had gone over the wall that was holding me back. I really liked being spontaneous, open minded and not in control. As a result, I was able to move towards doing bigger pieces without fear. My work became more enjoyable." - Peg McNinch

"I have more access to the creative part of my brain. Ideas are flowing, connections being made with ease." - Ann Russ

Sharing Arter Projects...

Escanaba Arter, *Rachel Fix*, has been creating an image each day. At the end of the day she chooses a single word to describe the image. She's curious about discovering patterns of images she's been drawn to over the 100 day period. Here is one of Rachel's images (more in the Virtual Gallery on our website).



Arter *Diana Magnuson* is using the 100 day project as a vehicle for writing and illustrating a children's book about the environment. Here are some of her illustrations.
